<u>James. A. Brown-</u> 1958 Hoover High graduate. President and owner of the Classic Auto group in the Mentor area. Well known for his philanthropic support in the area.

<u>Gary Giammarco DDS</u>- Has practiced dentistry in the area for 43 years. Very active in the community and has been the President of North Canton Little League baseball for 26 years.

Meals on Wheels.





Bob was also very active in high school. He was in NHS 2 years, FCA 2 years, basketball 4 years, football 4 years and track 3 years.

Bob Smart received a BS in Mechanical Engineering from Purdue University in 1996. He has worked in Florida for Harris Company and Cincinnati Machine doing engineering and large scale machinery sales. Bob moved back to Canton to work in the family business at Superior Machine Company. Over the past 11 years he has accumulated investment property in Stark County and 2013 he left Superior Machine to manage the properties full-time and to rep for Haines and company on the side.

Bob and Jamie met up again in 2001, they knew each other in high school but ran with different crowds at the time. Evan Bitzer Schiltz (Evie)

Born: October 29, 1914, New Berlin, Ohio Died: October 25, 2000, North Canton, Ohio

A North Canton Sun article on January 7, 1926 noted that young Schiltz won the Community Building boys' billiards tournament. It was an inkling of the versatility that marked his sports career. In high school, he was the leading scorer on the 1932 basketball team which posted a 21–7 record, won the county championship and advanced to the state tournament for the first time. In the same spring, Evie set a school pole vault record of 11 feet, 1 3/8 inches that stood for nearly 30 years. Before the summer was over, he also won the Stark County junior golf championship.

Moving on to Mount Union College, he starred in basketball, track and golf, winning All Ohio Conference honors in basketball. In 1971, Schiltz was elected to the college's athletic Hall of Fame. Later he continued to play amateur basketball with the Hoover Sweepers in the late 1930's, leading the team to the finals in the 1939 state industrial semi-pro title game.

Schiltz's lasting fame was yet to come on the golf course where he established himself as one of the areas finest over the next 30 years. He won the county district golf championship twice in 1936 and 1946, qualified for the U. S. Amateur golf championship and was a four time club champion at Brookside Country Club. He also found time to teach golf professionally at Edgewood Golf Course from 1947-57.


Schiltz was a 43 year employee of the Hoover Company. He also actively participated in numerous roles in city government and civic affairs for many years.
