

In this issue we would like to feature a sister and brother who both graduated from Hoover High School and who have both remained in the area. They are Marcy and Dave King.

Marcy graduated from Hoover in 1971. During high school she was an active member of the Girls Athletic Association (GAA). Marcy was Vice President as a junior and President as a senior. She was also in Choir all four years. She was selected as the Repository Teen of the Month in April, 1971. She always wanted a career in nursing until taking Latin her freshman year. Then she switched to secretarial and clerical classes which led to a lifetime career of working for the Federal Government. After graduation, she left North Canton to take a civilian position with the Department of Defense, United States Marine Corps in Washington D.C. She spent 14 months in D.C. and was so homesick she returned to Canton to attend Kent State University majoring in education. After a year of college, she ran out of money and had to return to work. Since she had worked for the Federal Government, she reapplied to the Social Security Administration and was hired in June, 1973. That led to a 40 year career as a public servant. She was honored by the Chicago Regional Commissioner for outstanding service.

During her free time, Marcy was a catcher for the North Canton Buffalo Hills softball team which played in the Ohio-Michigan Womens' Fast Pitch league. They usually played 4 games each weekend. She was selected as the league's All-Star catcher in 1978. Marcy was also very active in bowling. She bowled in league play for 42 years. She was active in the Canton Women's Bowling Association and was selected into their Hall of Fame in 2002. She has bowled in 26 National Tournament all over the U.S.

Marcy retired in 2011 and spends her winters in Cypress Lake Retirement Community in Lakeland, Florida. She enjoys her time in Florida but is always thrilled to come back home to North Canton.

Dave King graduated in 1976. He and his wife Linda were married in 1980 and continue to reside and raise their children in North Canton. They are the parents of Amanda (2001), Amy (2005) and Andrew (2010).

Dave attended college at Kent State and Ohio U. before returning to North Canton to work for the Timken Company. He attended Walsh College and entered a continuing education program with Timken. He graduated in 1985 with a dual degree in Finance and Management. Dave then left Timken and joined the Hoover Company from 1987 to 1992. He then left Hoover to become Director of Credit and Cash Management for the Genie Company in Alliance. The job at Genie lasted until 1997 when Dave joined Associated Materials. He spent 10 years in Finance and the last 8 in sales administration. He is now Senior Vice President and Chief Commercial Officer.

Dave feels fortunate to have grown up in North Canton. He feels blessed to have been employed in the area and been able to maintain his ties with the North Canton Schools and

community.

Donald Ray Hertler, Sr. (Don) Born: May 9, 1928 Bridgeport, OH

Died: Sept. 25, 2013 Canton, OH

Although his much acclaimed Hoover High School football coaching accomplishments are widely recognized, Don Hertler's first love arguably was baseball. As a youngster, he played all sports at Bridgeport High School and summer semi-pro baseball with town teams in Bridgeport and Wheeling, WV. After an 18-month stint with the U.S. Army's 21st Infantry Regiment in Japan, he went on the G.I. Bill to Wittenberg University where he concentrated on baseball and football. He coached the Hoover High School baseball team for 17 years, actually winning more baseball games (220) than football games. He even found time to play baseball one year (1954) with the Hoover Company City Class "A" League team.

After graduating from Wittenberg in 1951 with a B.A. in Health and Physical Education, Hertler spent two years teaching and coaching at State Street Junior High School in Marion, OH. He arrived in North Canton as an assistant football coach under Mike Skuban in 1953- a year the Vikings failed to win a game! Between 1953 and 1959, he coached baseball, wrestling, football and carried a full teaching load.

Hertler's 21 years as head football coach at Hoover have been well covered- 163 wins, 43 losses, 3 ties, a .788 winning percentage. He had no losing seasons and two undefeated teams. During his tenure, the Vikings won 7 Federal League titles. He was named Federal League Coach of the Year 7 times and Stark County Coach of the Year twice and coached in all-star games at the county, state and inter-state levels.


Numerous awards and honors have been given to Hertler since his retirement from teaching. He also continued for many years to take an active role in school and community affairs, serving as Director of the OHSAA district meets in baseball, track, softball and basketball, North Canton City Recreation Director and board member and working with the city youth football and summer baseball programs.

Hertler is in the Ohio Football Coaches Hall of Fame (1987), Stark County Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame (1991) and Stark County High School Football Hall of Fame (2003). In 2011, he finally made the Bridgeport High School Hall of Fame and had the field at Memorial Stadium named "Don Hertler Sr. Field". 2011 was very good year for Don Hertler.
