2016 Scholarship Winners



In this issue we'd like to feature sisters Pat Garisto and Debbie Knisely. Pat was born April 4, 1951 in Ravenna, Ohio. The family moved to Hartville when she was preschool age. Her father (Gordon) taught and coached at Marlboro High School at that time. They next moved to North Canton and became Vikings. Pat started at Portage School and moved on to Clearmount elementary. She then attended the Junior High and then on to Hoover High School. Pat was an attendance office aide, member of the Booster Club, Future Teachers, GAA, yearbook staff, Band and choir.

After high school Pat moved on to Kent State University (1969) where she studied to become a teacher. Following graduation from Kent she was employed by Field Local Schools for 30 years. She also spent two years at Gwinnet County Schools in Atlanta teaching Autism and Aspergers there. What an experience.

Pat's inspiration for teaching came from all those great teachers she had while in the North Canton City Schools. She is also a breast cancer survivor. She still attends many Hoover sporting events with her dad (Gordon) daughter (Julie) and her son-in-law. They proudly wear Orange & Black.

Pat's sister Debbie graduated from Hoover in 1970. She was on Student Council, Art Club, Chorus, Yearbook, Booster Club and was an office aide. She moved on to Kent State and achieved a Bachelor of Science in HPE and English in 1975. Debbie moved onto Akron University and received her Master's Degree in 1982.

Her teaching experience includes 4 1/2 years in Ohio, 3 years in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, 19 years in Florida and the last 10 years in Virginia as a librarian. Debbie's hobbies include traveling, photography, sports and reading. Future plans: retiring in 2017 and writing the next great American novel.

This is the 18th in a series of articles by Jim Holl about well known athletes from North Canton and Hoover High School.

Raymond Archibald Swope (Ray)- Born: July 15, 1911, New Berlin, Ohio.

Died: Nov. 4, 1984, Canton, Ohio.


As the coach of the 1939 state Class B basketball champions, Swope holds a special place in the hearts of North Canton sports fans. He guided a team which lost four of its first five games and then reeled off 22 straight wins climaxed by a spine-tingling 24-23 victory over Sandusky St. Mary to claim the title. But there were other accomplishments as well.

An all-county tackle, Swope graduated from North Canton in 1929 and continued his football career at Mount Union College before returning to his hometown in 1935 to take up coaching duties in both football and basketball. Where the high school teams had previously experienced only modest successes, Swope built both programs into winners. When he left in 1942 to take a coaching position at Greenville, Ohio, his football teams had won 32 games, lost 26 and tied 4. His basketball teams posted a sparkling 110-43 record which included a 44 game winning streak.


Swope enjoyed similar success at Greenville where his 1944 football team went undefeated only two years after not winning a game. In 1949 he returned to North Canton for a second time and coached both football and basketball for two more years. He retired from coaching after the 1952 season but continued to teach high school mathematics and government until 1968.

Swope's overall coaching record of 43 wins, 34 losses and 4 ties in football and 137 wins and 70 losses in basketball was good, if not spectacular. But on his watch, the Viking mascot was introduced, the Orange and Black colors were adopted and halftime band shows and the adult booster club were started. It would set the stage for high school athletic traditions for generations to come.
