From The Strength of Our Past By Jim Malone

Jim Malone shared this quick interview about his father, former Superintendent E. R. Malone.

E. R. Malone was Superintendent of North Canton City Schools for 15 years, from 1954 until his retirement in 1969. During his tenure, fantastic progress was achieved for the city's school system. Bond issues passed, permitting the building of two elementary schools, Orchard Hill and Clearmount, plus this same time frame also saw the construction of Hoover High School, (which is now North Canton's Middle School).

The district also enlarged to include Greentown. Mr. Malone expanded the curriculum in the city schools to include health education, art instruction, and physical education. At Hoover High, he inaugurated the guidance program, strengthened the faculty, and increased its curriculum. And amazingly, during his thirty years of administrative work, he only saw one tax levy defeated!

North Canton New School Proposal Tied To School Levy Defeated Last November

This news may come as a surprise to some of you depending on how closely you keep up with events in your old home town. School Superintendent Jeff Wendorf last March recommended that the district demolish six of its seven school buildings and build three new schools. A committee studying the facilities of the North Canton City School District wanted to reconfigure the district's seven buildings into four that more closely aligned with the direction of the city's population growth (to the North of town), while simultaneously updating the available facilities and hoping to take advantage of available money coming from the Ohio Facility Construction Commission.

After a four-month evaluation the steering committee recommended the following:

- To demolish the Mary L. Evans Childhood Center, (the former Portage Elementary) built in 1922
- To demolish two elementary schools, Clearmount built in 1959, and Northwood built in 1971.
- To demolish two intermediate schools, Greentown built in 1928,

and Orchard Hill built in 1956.

• To demolish one middle school, the former Hoover High School located on Fair Oaks built in 1957.

In their place they proposed to build two elementary schools for students from pre-kindergarten to fifth grade, one middle school for students from sixth through eighth grades, with Hoover High School on Seventh Street N.E., being renovated under the plan, and continuing to serve students in grades 9-12.

However the ballot issue for the proposal was rejected by voters with the unofficial results showing 68 percent opposed, and only 32 percent in support.

Plans now call for a new tax levy for the May 2018 ballot, with the Financial Advisory Committee also recommending postponing all of the new facilities projects.
