The utilization of the older, larger multi-colored lights back then that were so common, hold a fond memory for many of us. Some have memories of the activities surrounding our places of worship. Still others lean towards their ever-present involvement

Alumni Directory Update

The Alumni Association has worked with publishers in the past to collect alumni information and publish a single-volume directory of graduates. Our last effort to do this was in 2008 with Harris Publishing. This past year the Alumni Association determined that we would like to do this again. Harris Publishing was purchased by Publishing Concepts (PCI), and we have partnered with PCI to contact alumni, compile the data, and publish a new directory.

We hope all of you were contacted by PCI via phone, e-mail, or postcard, with instructions on updating your contact information. This was NOT a scam! They provided the manpower to contact thousands of graduates so that our new directory is a useful tool for the Alumni Assocation and your class year reunion committees. PCI does make a pitch to sell you items (that's how they make money!) and we hope that their sales pitch was not too painful.

So where are we in the process? PCI is in the home stretch. They have collected and compiled all of our data. During January they will proof the data and the artwork for the directory. They will have final approvals in March, and will ship in May.

I want to thank all who provided updated information on themselves and family members. It is this updated information that will help us keep in touch with our thousands of graduates.

You can help us with:


- Scholarship committee


