Former Standout Hoover Graduates Face Life Obstacles That Hopefully The Rest Of Us Will Never Know

I wish I could say it.

It would be wonderful beyond words to proclaim that I have known someone in this life who has never faced a problem. Could you even imagine?

The closest I've ever come was with a gentleman I volunteered with at a local institution. Floyd is now pushing 96 years old, and when I asked him about how one goes about making it to that ripe old age (in the vague hope that I'll be able to do it myself), I also asked him how many medications he must now be taking.

His answer? Not even one.

And yet for most of us, not only are we taking pills for different ailments, our collective journeys in this world are oh so very different from one another, with each of us facing so many different challenges. While we all come under fire with a new life challenge from time to time, some of the problems others entail make ours pale by comparison; we have none.

Two recent stories from former grads that we have learned of prove this point: Susie Hertler VanVranken and Jud Logan.

For Susie Hertler Van Vranken it has been a different life journey. Susie (Hoover Class of 1974) has dedicated her life to other people's physical fitness. She's a former health and physical education teacher, (being the daughter of

former head football coach Don Hertler and the sister of former head football coach Don Hertler Jr., one can definitely say that athletics runs in the family) and she has also been a very active community volunteer having served on the North Canton Board of Education for the past four years.

Susie was unfortunately also surprised by a recent medical diagnosis: amyotrophic lateral schlerosis, more commonly known as ALS or Lou Gehrig's disease.

ALS can start with a weakness in the hands and/or legs, and also possibly twitching, and there are also many other symptoms which mark the disease. ALS causes the progressive degeneration of motor neurons, resulting in progressive muscle weakness and atrophy.

This past December marked the

last meeting that she attended as part of the Board of Education. She felt it was in the best interests of all concerned that she complete her 4-year term and not run for reelection due to her health concerns.

A member of the Aultman Hospital Women's Board, Susie also co-founded The North Canton Alumni Association and the North Canton Alumni Association Hall of Distinction Awards Banquet, where she was recognized in 2018 with their Distinguished Service Award. She has also served on the Board of the North Canton YMCA and also the city's Parks and Recreation Board, and served as the health & Physical Education Department Chairperson for the North Canton City School District

She was lauded for her actions by many of her co-workers, fellow board members and family during her final meeting, including

Jud Logan

Jud Logan (Hoover Class of 1977) most people know not only as a former standout Hoover and college football player, but also from his days as an American athlete who competed in the hammer throw in four different Summer Olympics. Nowadays, Jud resides in Ashland, Ohio, where he has coached the Ashland University track team since 1994, becoming their head

coach in 2004.

All glory and a glorious life, right? Well, until like Jud, you are suddenly surprised with a diagnosis of B-Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia.

Jud's problems began in February of 2019 when he noticed that he was bruising easily. Then came the cold he caught around Christmas which lingered into February. After a visit to his primary care doctor it was determined that his blood platelet count was abnormally low. A trip to University Hospital the next day revealed that it had dipped even further overnight. After one missed diagnosis the doctors ran more tests. That's when he found out about the rare childhood disease that only afflicts about 300 males in the United States over the age of 40.


Jud never gave a thought to playing the 'why me' card. Instead, he walked into the Cleveland Clinic's oncology department and met the doctor in charge of saving his life, and in true athletic form said, "I'm your patient, but you're my head coach. Tell me what I need to do and I will exceed everything you ask me to do at every turn."

"You need to do three things," he says, in full coach mode. First, "Set short-term goals and beat them. You can't reach the top of the cathedral without laying the bricks on the base."

Secondly, he says to rely on your support system – your family and friends. "You don't have to go on this journey alone," states Jud.

"And third, believe in your team. There's a reason I went to Cleveland Clinic. This is what they do. They're good at it. Let them do the job."

New Athletic Murals Added To Gymnasium Entrance







Welcome North Canton Mayor Stephan Wilder

Former Auxillary Officer, D.A.R.E. Officer, Lieutenant and Police Chief Sworn In As Our Fair City's Mayor

On election day last November, North Canton residents decided that it was time for a change at the head of their city government and elected their former Police Chief and D.A.R.E. Officer (that some of you may remember from your time in elementary school) Stephan Wilder as their new mayor.

Former Police Chief Stephan Wilder ran on a platform of communication, collaboration and cooperation.

He beat 14-year incumbent Mayor David Held, 62% to 38%, according to unofficial results.

Wilder, 68, retired as North Canton Police Chief in 2017 after more than 36 years on the force.

"It's a very exciting moment for me," Wilder said. "In a way, it's kind of overwhelming. It's also very humbling. My heart has always been in the city. And I still have that desire to do the best we can and represent us well throughout whatever we do here."
